

## PASTORAL MESSAGE FROM BISHOP SIMARD FOR THE 2023-2024 PASTORAL YEAR

## TOGETHER LET'S CONTINUE TO BUILD THE KINGDOM!

Alone we may go faster, but together we go further. For the past three years, our pastoral theme has been to spread happiness, inspired by the Beatitudes, the charter of the Kingdom. More specifically, we wanted to be open to the Word of God and to listen to the cries of our brothers and sisters in need, to give with a generous and loving heart, to offer our hands to build a world of justice, peace and solidarity. The Synodal process inaugurated by Pope Francis has given us an urgent call to walk together in our common mission to make disciples, to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to build the Kingdom of God in word and deed.

On the other hand, the building of the Kingdom does not rest on our shoulders alone; it is achieved through the participation of each and every one of us, through the commitment of all men and women, but also of all people of goodwill who want a world transformed by a love that shares, helps, empowers, reconciles and brings justice.

His Spirit continues to breathe in our communities and to act in the hearts of the young, the not so young, the elderly and the children who dare to open up to His presence in their lives. If, together, we immerse ourselves in the heart of Jesus and Mary our Mother, if we allow ourselves to be touched by the heart of God who loves the world so much, we will become bearers of His light and witnesses to the hope that there is always a future in God and with God.
