

Activity / Event	PILGRIMAGE OF SAINT JOSEPH – TOGETHER ON THAT JOURNEY
Date	August 19 to September 27, 2021
Activity / Event	 TOGETHER ON THAT JOURNEY! this is the theme of the pilgrimage that we propose to you in this special year dedicated to Saint Joseph, which will take place from August 19 to September 27, 2021 - World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Promotion of this activity through the Parish Bulletin, your social networks, and also by approaching families, young people in catechesis, people in residences for the elderly. with Saint Joseph, we are TOGETHER ON THAT JOURNEY!
Details	 Over a period of 40 days, an individual pilgrim is invited to walk 100km, it is also possible to experience this pilgrimage as a family, in which case will be proposed a distance of 250km. If, for various reasons, the pilgrim cannot physically take part in this pilgrimage, he can join in by praying a rosary to St. Joseph each day.
Get into a spirit of pilgrimage	 In the Pilgrim's Notebook, the pilgrim is invited to write the number of km walked for the day, or to check if a rosary has been recited. No special equipment is needed to calculate the distance walked, the simple rule of "15 minute walk = 1km" is enough! What is important is the disposition of your heart when you go for a walk, whether you pay particular attention to the situation of migrants and refugees, or even to you own displacements, voluntary or not, that you are experiencing (loss of job, moving, separation). For this purpose, the text of the Flight into Egypt can be found in the Pilgrim's Notebook.
Procedures for regristration	 For registration, each parish receives an Excel file to enter the name of the pilgrim / family, indicating the language for the certificate and the email for the invitation to a Zoom conference.

Zoom conference	 When registering, give to the pilgrim / family a leaflet with the explanation. When registering, give to the pilgrim / family a leaflet with the explanation. <i>Ensemble</i> When registering, give the pilgrim / family a Pilgrim's Notebook in which they will keep track of the kilometers walked or rosaries recited. MAKE SURE that the Notebook number matches the entry line number. At the end of the pilgrimage, the pilgrims are invited to present their Notebook to the parish, in order to receive their certificate signed by Bishop Simard. In mid-September, a conference in ZOOM will be held with Mrs. Alessandra Santopadre, director of the Centre d'accueil pour demandeu rs ses d'asile LE PONT.
