**SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI,  
THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**  
**“O Sacrament most holy; O Sacrament divine;  
all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine.”**  
The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Jesus  
Christ, the Son of God, comes to us in every Mass under the form  
of bread and wine. The Eucharist is a celebration of the love of  
Jesus for us, His blood shed for us in love and His body scourged,  
crowned with thorns and crucified for us. The wine poured and the  
bread broken is the love of Jesus for us. Outside of Mass, Jesus  
remains in the Tabernacle in church where we have a wonderful  
opportunity to trust, surrender, believe and receive His love.  
As a symbol of our love, Father Jerome we will carry Jesus in the  
monstrance in procession just before the 10 A.M Mass on Sunday  
morning, June 23<sup>rd</sup>. When Jesus passes us in the Blessed  
Sacrament, we adore Him and thank Him for loving us so much.  
Try to put words on the deepest healing of your life that you need  
as you pray for Jesus to heal you. Remember the words of the  
consecration of every Mass recalling Jesus giving Himself for us,  
“This is my Body which will be given up for you... This is the cup of  
my blood poured out for you.” May Jesus in the Eucharist always  
be the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of  
our faith, the center and heart of our parish, and the center and  
heart of our lives.

**JUNE 24 THE NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST**  
On June 24 we celebrate the birth of St. John the Baptist, son of  
Zechariah and Elizabeth. The Gospel of Luke tells us that the  
angel Gabriel announced his birth to his father and gave him the  
name John, which means “God is gracious.” (Luke 1:8-23) Even  
while still in his mother’s womb John recognized the presence of  
Jesus by leaping when Mary visited Elizabeth (Luke 1:41). When  
people began to wonder if John was the Messiah, he reassured  
them that he was not. He declared that his ministry was preparing  
for the coming of the Messiah, “I have baptized you with water, but  
he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.” (Mark 1:8) When Jesus  
came to John asking for baptism, John recognized Jesus at once  
and said, “Look, there is the lamb of God who takes away the sins  
of the world.” (John 1:29) These words have found their way into  
the prayer of Mass when the priest holds up the Sacred Host as we  
prepare for Holy Communion he says, “Behold the Lamb of God  
who takes away the sins of the world.”

This week we also celebrate the feast of St. Thomas More, born in  
London in 1478. He studied law and entered Parliament in 1504.  
When Henry VIII and his wife Katherine of Aragón had no children,  
Henry divorced her and married Anne Boleyn so that there would  
be heirs to the throne. Parliament passed a law forcing clergy to  
acknowledge Henry as the supreme head of the Church. Thomas  
More refused to do so and resigned as Lord Chancellor. He was  
aware that just because something is lawful does not mean it is  
morally right. When Thomas refused to take the oath, he was  
imprisoned in the Tower of London and later beheaded on July 6<sup>th</sup>  
1535. His final words were, “The King’s good servant, but God’s  
first.” He was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1935.

Both John the Baptist and Thomas More had the courage to uphold  
the truth about marriage, and they challenge us in a time when it is  
not popular to speak the truth or live by the truth. They remind us  
that just because certain behavior is enshrined in the law of the  
land does not mean that it is morally right. Fix our eyes on Jesus.  
“He must increase; I must decrease.”
