SAINT BARNABAS (JUNE 11) Barnabas, a Jew from Cyprus, came to Jerusalem, where he joined the Christian community. The apostles changed his name from Joseph to Barnabas or "man of encouragement." Our knowledge of Barnabas is recorded by Luke in Acts: he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. It was Barnabas who accepted Paul's side for many years as his partner evangelizing the Gentiles. Tradition says he was stoned to death in Cyprus about the year 61.

PENTECOST SUNDAY June 9, 2019

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." John 20:

On D-Day, 75 years ago on June 6, 1944, more than 5,000 ships, 50,000 vehicles, and 11,000 planes were involved in the assault along a 50-mile stretch of the Normandy coast. At the end of 5 days, nearly 10,000 Allied soldiers were killed, wounded, missing, or captured. That day there was no peace. Yet, God put greatness into the hearts of all our fellow-citizens who participated in that invasion meant to bring the European War to an end. Members of our own families showed greatness.

We Christians have a symbol for courage. It is the cross. It is God's Love, the Holy Spirit, Who swells my heart at such times. The peace that the Holy Spirit gives me enables me to bring right order into situations. Jesus prayed to the Father, "I pray that the love with which You loved Me may be in them and I in them." BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH (June 10):

Mary, the Mother of the Church was instituted by Pope Francis on February 11, 2018.- the 160th anniversary of the apparition of Mary at Lourdes. The title "mother of the Church" was bestowed on the Blessed Virgin Mary during the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI who declared that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this "tenderest of titles." This movable feast is observed on the Monday following Pentecost and takes precedence over other memorials which may fall on the same day.

PENTECOST

Locked doors and locked hearts do not deter the Risen Christ. Literally and figuratively, the apostles were locked behind closed doors. They were locked in the upper room, fearful of the authorities. They were also locked inside their own fear, anger, guilt and grief.. and Jesus broke through it all.

He appeared suddenly in their midst and shared with them the first gifts of the Resurrection: forgiveness and peace. He commissioned them to share those gifts with others. He sent them out, as the Father had sent him. The peace of the Risen Lord, and all the gifts of his Spirit, would unlock the door of the upper room – and also unlock the disciples' hearts and lives.

We see this in Acts, where the peace and joy they have received are communicated to others: Jews and non-Jews, strangers from many countries, people of many languages. The gifts the apostles received were sharable – more than that, contagious – and they were available for everyone. not just a select few. *Everyone*.

The apostles spoke a universal language on Pentecost: the language of love, peace, forgiveness, hope... the story of God's mighty deeds... the call to discipleship, to a life of love and self-giving. This call could be heard and understood by everyone: a call into relationship, with Christ and with one another.
