March 17 – Saint Patrick
Although legends abound concerning
the life and work of Patrick, Apostle of
Ireland, he tells us about himself in his
Confession. At 16, Patrick was carried
off from Wales in a pirate raid and sold
as a slave in Ireland. He was mad a
swineherd, living in solitude on a
mountain, where a life of prayer and
asceticism marked him forever.

After serving his master for six years, Patrick heard an inner voice tell him that he would return to his homeland, and he escaped. Landing in Gaul (Western Europe), Patrick had many adventures before reaching his parents in Britain. Later, he returned to Gaul to study for the priesthood, eventually becoming a bishop.

When the missionary to Ireland, Saint Palladius, died, Patrick took his place. By the time of his death in 492, he could see the fruits of his work: a native clergy in place, Christianity had reached nearly all of Ireland, and churches and monasteries had been established.

He is a patron of Ireland and Nigeria, of engineers, of several Canadian dioceses, and of those who fear snakes.
