SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

If we wish to learn the art of living well and dying well, let us not follow the crowd, which only believes and values what is seen. Instead let us follow Christ.

REFLECTION

The institution of the Lord's Supper is one of my favorite stories in the New Testament. It is comforting to read and remember that Jesus fed Judas, even though he knew of the betrayal that was to come.

But I am troubled by the discussion the disciples have after Jesus tells of the impending betraval. They ask one another who could possibly act in such a way against Jesus. The real answer is that it could have been any one of them! We are not given the reason for Judas' betrayal, which makes understanding the true purpose impossible. But this also raises the question of whether I would, like Judas, betray Jesus. I like to think not. But then I remember the unkind words to a coworker or the time when I failed to provide for someone less fortunate. Every time I act in a way that is counter to "What would Jesus do?" I fail him. And then I remember the new covenant and am fed again and again as I return to the table and ask forgiveness and try, each day, to do better than the day before.
