Something to think about...

Unity is a divine mandate at the core of our
Christian identity, more than simply an
ideal. It represents the essence of the
Church's calling – a call to reflect the
harmonious oneness of our life in Christ
amidst our diversity. This divine unity is
central to our mission and is sustained by
the profound love of Jesus Christ, who has
set before us a unified purpose. As the
Apostle Paul asserts in his letter to the
Ephesians, "there is one body and one
Spirit, just as you were called to the one
hope of your calling". This Bible verse,
chosen for this year, encapsulates the
theological depth of Christian unity.

Throughout the Holy Scriptures, God's
call to unity resonates from the earliest
times. Starting with the Old Testament,

Abram's pleas to Lot highlights the divine
desire for peace and harmony amidst the
faithful: "Let there be no strife between
you and me; for we are kindred".

In the New Testament, Jesus Christ
elevates the concept of unity to a spiritual
dimension. Unity among his followers is
not merely the absence of conflict but a
deep, spiritual bond reflecting the unity of
the Holy Trinity.

Let us embrace this divine calling to
unity, not as an abstract ideal but as a vital
expression of our faith.
