REFLECTION

February 2, besides being  
Groundhog Day is more importantly  
the Presentation of the Lord!

When the time came for their  
purification according to the law of  
Moses, Mary and Joseph brought the  
child Jesus up to Jerusalem to  
present him to the Lord. Every  
firstborn male shall be designated as  
holy to the Lord. The presentation  
stands as the fourth Joyful Mystery  
of the Rosary.

The observance of this feast began  
in the 4<sup>th</sup> century Jerusalem, and was  
celebrated in Rome by the 5<sup>th</sup>  
century. It is the feast of both Our  
Lord and the Blessed Virgin. In the  
Eastern Church, it was called The  
Meeting of Jesus and Mary with  
Simeon and Anna, representatives of  
the Old Covenant.

In the Middle Ages, a tradition  
began of blessing candles and  
holding a procession of light on this  
day. As a result, this feast is also  
known as Candlemas: Christ our  
light has come to us.
