AT THE WELL

This is a story of water and thirst;
between an outcast woman and a
giver of hope; between one abyss
and another. To enter into a
relationship with the Samaritan
woman, Jesus places himself in need
by asking her for a drink. He
awakens in this woman another

Jesus bring the living water that can
quench her thirst? With a look of
love that inspires confidence and
brings forth an awakening. Just like
the old fashion hand pumps, it takes
a little water to bring a great quantity
of water. Just one look of love can

The water that Jesus was talking
about is trust. He says: "He who

sees things in the same way. She is
